Reported that in the near future, the highway department will be declaring items for surplus that are no longer useful or needed by the department.

The Highway Committee questioned how long before the replacement truck will be ready? Superintendent stated he will email the company for a timeframe.

TOWN CLERK'S REPORT:

Provided my financial report to the Board.

Reported that after collecting \$3,388,459.80, I am now 80% collected of my total tax warrant.

Reported that for a few years I have always placed the current year's tax bills on our software providers website so that property owners, attorneys and abstractors could have access to the current bill information. This year, the company had done away with the current Tier option but did not allow for the tax collectors to have ample time to budget for this so they placed all the tax information which includes the bills that are paid on their website for free this year.

I would now like to start discussion for the next budget season to continue this very informative and time savings technology. The first initial system configuration of \$2,860 can be split between two years. The annual maintenance and support fee would be \$600.00.

I would also like to inform the Board that Business Automation Services will be coming to the Town Hall to offer a quote for online backup and disaster recovery protection. Should something happen where the computers are not retrievable, this protection can have the Town up and running again in any location as long as there is computer access. This protection will also allow for protection of documents on all computers within the Town and provided centralized virus protection and firewall security.

RESOLUTON #49 <u>2015 BUDGET AMENDMENTS</u>

A motion was made by Councilman Rodriguez-Betancourt, seconded by Govern accepting and approving the 2015 Budget Amendments as presented. All in favor, motion carried.

CEO/DOG CONTROL REPORT:

CEO Dutcher first addressed Mr. Graupman's concern with "junk" cars along side Town roads.

CEO Dutcher stated that the law allows for restoration vehicles and derby cars that are registered in an event; otherwise the one unregistered vehicle applies. Supervisor Gregory requested that CEO Dutcher visit the area in question and look for properties in violation.

CEO Dutcher stated typically people will work on derby cars a month or two prior to an event and then haul them to scrap. By the end of September he starts making his rounds to address those still hanging around. Unfortunately, scrap prices are way down and people are trying to hold onto them until prices go back up.

Supervisor Gregory brought back to the table the discussion on Compensatory Storage. Councilperson Wood felt the law was still too restrictive. CEO Dutcher stated "yes its restrictive, that is the point." It is so people can't' keep building in the floodplain.

Councilman Armstrong requested to table the matter once again to review flood maps. It was agreed that the Board would move forward with the other two laws.

RESOLUTION #50 FLOOD DAMAGE PREVENTION LAW

A motion was made by Councilman Armstrong, seconded by Govern granting permission to forward the proposed Flood Damage Prevention Law to the DEC and to include Repetitive Damages, and Critical Facilities. All in favor, motion carried.

SUPERVISOR'S REPORT:

Maureen Blanchard of Smart Streets approached the Board to inform them of a Smart Streets grant available through the NYS Department of Health. She stated the need to address health benefits, safer walk able areas, scooters accessibility, economic benefit and safer for the elderly.

Ms. Blachard stated that many grants coming up are asking if municipalities have implemented Smart Streets.

Many questions developed and it was decided the Highway Committee would look into the information and bring back to the Board.

Supervisor Gregory informed the Board that the Justice would like to purchase a desk for the clerk. The Board was in agreement.

Supervisor Gregory presented the Board with the Memorandum of Master Management Agreement with Crown Communications to add Verizon as a carrier on our tower.
