Section 1. Legislative Intent

It is the intent of this local law to opt out of allowing cannabis retail dispensaries and onsite cannabis consumption sites in the Town of Walton that would otherwise be allowed under Cannabis Law Article 4.

Section 2. Authority

This local law is adopted pursuant to Cannabis Law § 131 which expressly authorizes the town board to adopt a local law requesting the Cannabis Control Board to prohibit the establishment of cannabis retail dispensary licenses and/or on-site consumption licenses within the jurisdiction of the town and is subject to a permissive referendum, the procedure of which is governed by Municipal Home Rule Law § 24.

Section 3. Local Opt-Out

The Town Board of the Town of Walton hereby opts out of allowing cannabis retail dispensaries and on-site cannabis consumption sites from being established and operated within the town's jurisdiction.

Section 4. Severability

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this Local Law or the application thereof to any person, firm or corporation, or circumstance, shall be adjusted by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such order or judgement shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this Local Law or in its application to the person, individual, firm or corporation or circumstance, directly involved in the controversy in which such judgement or order shall be rendered.

Section 5. Permissive Referendum/Referendum on Petition

This local law is subject to a referendum on petition in accordance with Cannabis Law § 131 and the procedure outlined in Municipal Home Rule Law § 24.

Section 5. Effective date

This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.

Project:

Dr. Rezk Abdelrahman is seeking to a new business, McRez Packing Inc., as a USDA certified meat and poultry processing facility. MPI would seek to process cattle, pigs, goats, sheep and chicken purchased from local and regional farms for wholesale and retail sales. They would also offer custom processing services for farmers. MPI would begin with the construction of a 4,000 sq/ft facility in the Walton Industrial Park, with the goal to expand to 12,000 sq/ft over time. The facility would operate Monday through Friday in a single shift in the first year, expanding to a second shift as growth requires. This project entails the construction of the initial 4,000 square foot facility, the purchase of machinery and equipment and working capital. Project costs are currently estimated at \$800,000. Financial assistance to be made available to the business through this grant would be approximately \$250,000. The project would result in the creation of up to 26 full-time jobs over two years.

Application Process:

- Preliminary Application: Requires Supervisor to certify that they have authorized the submission of a pre-application and to sign a preliminary budget form.
- Full Application: Would require the Town to hold a public hearing regarding the proposed project and adopt a resolution authorizing the submission of a formal application.
 Additional requirements include full commitment of all project financing and site plan approval by the Town of Walton Planning Board.

TOWN OF WALTON FEMA COORDINATOR REPORT

August 9, 2021

Homeland Security has approved the request for a time extension to complete project #83449. The date for completion is now 10/1/2022. The rest of the incomplete projects completion deadline remains 10/1/2021. We are on track to meet that deadline and all necessary environmental permits are in hand.

Project #83449 has also had some other activity since my last report. There was a request from FEMA'S EHP for an updated GPS location and site map for site #3 on Houck Mountain, which was completed and submitted. The project moved in the "Process Step" to "Pending FEMA 406 HMP Completion". Moved again to "QA Review", and is now back to "EHP Review".

EHP is requesting additional information needed for compliance for DR-4397 PW-00078, GM # 83449 — Integral Road Support Washout on Houck Mt. & Wake. In order for us to complete our review and necessary consultations, we respectfully request the following information: Location of Site # 3 on Houck Mountain Road. GPS is currently recorded as 43.120392, -75.124702 which does not show up on Houck Mountain Road.

This project has been under "EHP Review" since July 17, 2019. This series of projects are 0% complete and is worth about \$58,000.00 in reimbursement.

Project #83441, Woodlawn Road Integral Support Failure is still "Pending EHP Review" since March 13, 2020. This work is 100% complete and is worth about \$140,000.00 in reimbursement.

Project #83445, Beers Brook Road is still pending "Final FEMA Review" since September 28, 2020. This series of projects are about 70% complete and is worth about \$61,000.00 in reimbursement.

The last project with no determination on obligation is Project# 151549, "Management Costs". This will be on hold until all projects have been obligated per the IBD. This is worth about \$16,500.00 at this time.
