Executive Session:

Assessor's Report to Walton Town Board

This is a longer than usual report, being the first one filed since March. It's been a busy time. There was quite a bit of extra workload for assessors with extra exemptions and paperwork this year leading up to the May 1 filing of the tentative roll with the law requiring a second-notice postcard mailing for seniors letting them know about the senior partial exemption. There were calculations to do as well about income levels and the law changes to the senior exemption in all three of the County, Town and Village this year. There have been a few technology issues as well, detailed below, also Grievance Day to take care of.

Technology:

Photos: A couple of months ago I stopped being able to upload photos to the property records. This causes problems when valuing properties and keeping track of assessments that need to be changed. Delaware County IT and Nancy Stulligross are aware of the problem and have been communicating with me about it to get it fixed. There had been a problem in late 2021 which was resolve in 2022 which has resurfaced where older photos have 'disappeared' from the records, and recently this year it has become impossible to upload any photos at all. Thankfully the photos pre-existing 2021 are fine...for now.

Aerial Photos: I've also been communicating with IT and Eagle View to determine why certain areas of the aerial photo program I use are blocked out. With Ronda, Spectrum and ISD Matt Ross we determined it is not a Walton local problem: not the modem or our internet connection or computers. It is more widespread than that. Today Eagle View gave me a workaround which I will be testing out to see if it clears up the problem. And they are looking into how to resolve it on their end.

Sales are continuing at a slower pace than last year. The local Multiple Listing Service for Otsego, Delaware, Chenango and Broome counties has gone to a new website: NYS Alliance of MLS. I just found this out yesterday, and am working to gain access and be able to see all of Walton's current real estate listings.

Grievance Day was quiet with no one coming in, but the Board of Assessment Review still had to make made decisions on 11 properties, and complete the forms and letters accompanying them. Three grievances were filed but not heard due to lack of information provided on the complaint form. The BAR does a very nice job being aware of the routines, market values, and laws regarding assessment and the complaint process. The solar project will likely still need to be valued according to the recent law

change back to mandating assessors use the state model of valuation. However the former value still appears on the assessment roll and no grievance was filed regarding that value. 581-a values are still being discussed for Mountainview and Walton Housing projects to determine their assessments for this tax year.

New Taxable Values: The 2023 added taxable value estimates for the School, Town and Village are shown below. Also, the decrease in County taxable value due to the increase in Senior exemption levels is shown.

WHEREAS, this country was formed on the principles of democracy and our forefathers fought for our right to elect our representation; and

WHEREAS, the majority of the states in the U.S. require a voter's identification to increase the public's confidence and ensure a fair election process; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Elections may not get notification of a voter registering in another location or of a death of a registered voter; and

WHEREAS, in an economy where the Board of Elections may not have sufficient funding or staffing to purge voters rolls of individuals who no longer live in each election district or county, as required; and

WHEREAS, in a day and age where the ability to work does not necessarily need to be where you live, this allows for more individuals to be transient in nature and the addition of voter's identification will assist in keeping all voter rolls current; and

WHEREAS, in the State of New York the requirement is to compare the signature on file, this doesn't necessarily help maintain current voter registration, as name and address changes are not necessarily communicated in the current process, also this would assist in the purging of the roles of individuals who are no longer active voters in that county; and

WHEREAS, the subject of the resolution is not an action as defined by 6 N.Y.C.R.R. §617.2 (b), and therefore no further SEQRA review is required.

HEREBY REQUESTS the New York State Legislature and Governor Hochul to draft and enact legislation to allow for a voter's identification process to assist with maintaining voter's registration rolls; and

NOW, THEREFORE on consideration of the promises contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. The Town of Walton does hereby agree to pay the sum of Thirty Two Thousand (\$32,000.00) Dollars to the Village of Walton.
- 2. The Village of Walton agrees to Provide, without cost to the residents of the Town of Walton, the above listed programs and facilities during the year commencing June 1, 2023 and ending May 31, 2024.
