**Photos:** Ongoing. I met with 3 assessors and we exchanged information about how to upload photos. There hasn't been a resolution to the problem of not being able to add photos to the property records.

Sales for the year 7/2/22-6/30/23 will be updated and verified by August for use in the 2024 equalization rate. The feeling from the State is that the market values are

still increasing but not at the pace it was in 2021 and 2022. There hasn't been a decrease in market values.

**Reassessment:** Joe Cetta and I met virtually with John Wolham, Regional Director from NYS Office of Real Property Tax Services. John helped fill out a Request for Proposal form that we will use to solicit bids on a town-wide reassessment. John will continue to assist as we make decisions about what services are required.

I have joined the **MYSTATEMLS** system for a year at \$380. Our local Multiple Listing Service to access real estate listings disbanded earlier this year.

Supervisor Cetta stated he has intentions to meet with Supervisors Layton and Merrill to discuss ATV travel on town roads.

Councilman Govern recommended establishing local laws prior to having a group pick up.

Councilman Armstrong suggested making the UTV's and ATV's to be registered and to pressure the State to change legislation so that DMV is on the same page to allow UTV's to become registered over a certain weight.

Supervisor Cetta stated Penny and himself have been working with John Wolham, Regional Director from NYS Office of Real Property Tax Services to develop an RFP for re-assessment services. He stated more to follow on this as we work through this process.

Supervisor Cetta informed the Board that interviews have concluded on the Code Enforcement Officer position and the matter was tabled at this time.

#### **COMMITTEE REPORT:**

Supervisor Cetta stated he is still waiting for quotes from contractors for the install of a generator at the Baptist Church for an established Red Cross Emergency Shelter. He expects them within the next week.

Supervisor Cetta thanked the Village DPW for all their help at Veterans Plaza.

Discussion took place over the former Breakey's Motors site as to whether or not the work is completed on the property and when will the transfer of title take place. Supervisor Cetta stated he would follow up with the CWC.
